

Who are we called by the Holy Spirit to serve in our community and in the world?


- I) God comes to this world in the person of Jesus (Missio Dei);

Sense of Ownership

- Creates cohesion among members

- ✓ Promotes responsibility

III. SENSE OF OWNERSHIP VS PRIVATIZATION

- ✓ Identifies a ministry program or task with the person's ego
- ✓ Separates one function of the church from others
- ✓ Leaves some areas "untouchable" and unaccountable.

V. MINISTRIES BELONG TO THE CHURCH, NOT TO PARTICULAR INDIVIDUALS


- Ministries, however diverse, need to be recognized and owned by the church collectively, in accordance with its vision and direction.

VI. ALIGNMENT

There are many good things in which the church can engage. However, even good things and good work (programs, events, groups, and committees, etc.) could get the church pulled into many directions, spinning and getting lost along the way...leading hard-working people to wonder 'Why are we doing this?"



Various parts must correspond to one another in the same direction, e.g.,

- The church's missional call ("For what it is called by God to exist in this world?")
- Individual gifts and talents within the body of Christ (strengths as well as limitations)
- ☐ The needs of the world (local and global)
- Program management (concrete methods and means to carry out various ministries)

Scenario -

There is a growing number of children in the congregation and the consistory decides to create a position of a youth ministry coordinator (with stipend). Three candidates come forward;

VII. GIFT DISCERNMENT (OR INVENTORY) OVER PERSONAL HISTORIES/CONNECTIONS

A. is a relatively new member with a prior experience in youth mentoring program in her prior church in Chicago (and her college major was child psychology, taking courses at a near-by seminary)-

B. is a former youth program coordinator who has been inactive in the church since the previous pastor left (he now seems interested in returning to the church after having heard of this newly created position) -

C. is a long-time member (who was an occasional nursery attendant in the past) who happens to be your mother/father/sister/brother/cousin/your high school classmate -

VII. GIFT DISCERNMENT (OR INVENTORY) OVER PERSONAL HISTORIES/CONNECTIONS

The congregation (at a leadership level) must have a clear grasp of individual gifts (i.e., talents, skills, life experiences, passion, etc.) among its members and appropriately match them with its ministry needs.
